6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Upgradation of syllabus has taken place in July, 2013. Curriculum designing include basic and advanced knowledge in the field of biochemistry.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Plan of teaching of each subject is provided to students before the start of the course. Information on the website is also available. Seminars are delivered by the students to improve quality of presentation.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Regular class test and final exams are held according to the academic calendar. After evaluation, the answer books are shown to the students and the difficulties are discussed in the class by Faculty members.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research students are admitted to entrance exam as per UGC regulation. Ten research papers in peer reviewed journals have been published in 2013-2014. One Ph.D. degree was awarded during the year.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

About 200 books have been added in last 3 years. A number of e-journals are available. Three research labs are equipped with HPLC, electronic balances, water purifying system (Millipore), High speed and Ultra-centrifuges, and spectrophotometer.
