Report on Teaching-Learning Assessment Semester
July 2009 - December 2009

To give effect of better teaching-learning the institution an effective syllabus is designed as per the U.G.C. and B.C.I. guidelines for individual courses. School of Law offers three distinct courses at under graduate and postgraduate level.

- M. Phil. (Law)

Detailed respective subjects are taught in every course with their aim and objectives by the expertise and qualified faculties. Apart from the class-room teaching department provides the opportunities for other ancillary activities like seminar, assignments, internal tests twice in a semester and for the practical learning of students department organize and facilitates moot courts, legal aid camps and internship in the high court, Supreme Court and different law institutions. A course assessment file has been prepared in SOL for each subject taught by each faculty. The file contain attendance sheet, detailed course contains, test papers and teacher's report stating his observations about his own performance, experience and suggestions about subject and students. The main objective is to improve the academic quality of students and also to revise the

teaching strategies to improve the student's learning capacity by different psychological and scientific techniques.

The feedback forms prescribed by the university have been randomly circulated among the fifteen or twenty students from each course and each subject taught by each faculty member at the end of the semester examination and at last the course assessment file is submitted by each faculty along with the assessment forms before the assessment committee.

The report for the semester of July 09 - December 09 has been made after the review of the course assessment file and students feedback. A feedback form is classified into three sections (Section A, B and C), Whereas Section A provides the objective response on five point scale and part B provides for either positive, negative or neutral response and part C gives the option to give brief descriptive response. Comments and responses are relating to multiple factors of teaching and learning.
