 - v.** Common recreation, daily news papers, indoor games, Gym, rest room, wall-mounted TV of sufficient screen size with DTH: **Yes we have all these facilities. We access 07 different news papers, competition success, business today, C.S.R., Cronical, and India today magazine. Besides we are also having Indoor, outdoor, TV and rest room facilities.**
