

7. Organisation of Hostel Rooms and Facilities Maps:

The Hostel is mainly divided into two parts:

- (i) Guest block is having guest room for the stay of parents and family members of the students. One hall is for the stay of various teams visiting for University sports and cultural activities.
- (ii) Student block: It is our main Hostel, where 48 rooms are available. This is three floor building with 12 bathrooms and 18 toilets.

Games: Hostel is having a large space for outdoor games in front of the hostel building. We have both indoor and outdoor games facilities including Badminton, table tannis, Cricket, Volleyball and Caroum board.

Reading hall: Hostel has 24 x 7 facility of reading hall providing national and local news papers to enhance the scholarly environment.

Gymnasium: Hostel is well equipped gym having all the basic facilities required to maintain physical fitness and mental well being of the students.

Mess Hall: Hostel has good dinning hall for students that serve nutritous and delecius food along with an interactive environment.

Television Hall: is eqipped with television airtel dish connection for the intertanment of studens.

Warden residence: Warden residence is situated within the hostel premises so that Warden can have an eye on student activities.

- **10. Each Hostel Physical Facilities Record:**
 - a. Located in a properly planned and organized space: Yes
 - b. Sufficient physical living space available in each room in accordance with the national/ international standards: Yes
 - c. Attached or shared wash rooms and their regular cleanliness arrangements: Shared. Three employees contribute to maintain cleanliness of bathrooms, toilet, floors, and inside the rooms.
 - **d.** Rooms be furnishing with apt quality furniture (table, chair, bed, cupboard, racks and dressing table). Yes.
 - e. **Provision of natural light and proper ventilation:** Yes (can be validated physically).
 - f. Provisions for electrical accessories, fan, light arrangements and network cables, Wi-Fi accessibility: Yes, any problem in these arrangements usually solved by chief-warden office within few hours. The electrician, carpenter, plumbers available through chief-warden office.
 - g. Cleaning plan and schedule, and Cleanliness maintenance in strict manner, whether it is maintained in-house or from an external agency: It is maintained by University employees.
 - h. Provision for common facilities as follows:
 - i. Common facilities for drinking water along with purifiers and cooling, wash rooms equipped with washing machines, hot water supply: 02 Water Coolers with large capacities are further connected to every floor with drinking taps. For hot water, electric guizers are installed in each flore.
 - ii. Medical, first aid and doctor visiting room: Yes, room available, but Doctor visit as and when required.

- iii. Institute/university tie up with the reputed/ renowned hospital for serving specific or emergency situations: We can contact more than 05 nursing homes and 02 individual medical practinores at any time during emergency.
- iv. **Special rooms for parents:** Yes (Guest rooms), these rooms having separate toilets and bathrooms and entry /exit.
- v. Common recreation, daily news papers, indoor games, Gym, rest room, wall-mounted TV of sufficient screen size with DTH: Yes we have all these facilities: We access 03 different news papers and Pratiyogita Darpan magzine. Besides we are also having Indoor, outdoor, TV, Gym and rest room facilities.
- vi. Excellent modern kitchen orderly, neat and with dining hall with appropriate crockery for running Mess food facilities ensuring that the served food is healthy, nutritious, hygienic and satisfies guests of diverse cultures and locations: Yes.
- vii. Wi-Fi hotspots and Computer/Internet room: This is under progression.
- viii. Paintings of Nation Personalities at key places in the hostel, Names of prestegious Visitor and yearly events photographs, if any: 04 paintings in common hall, while 03 on other places. Yes CD available.
