4. Mission :

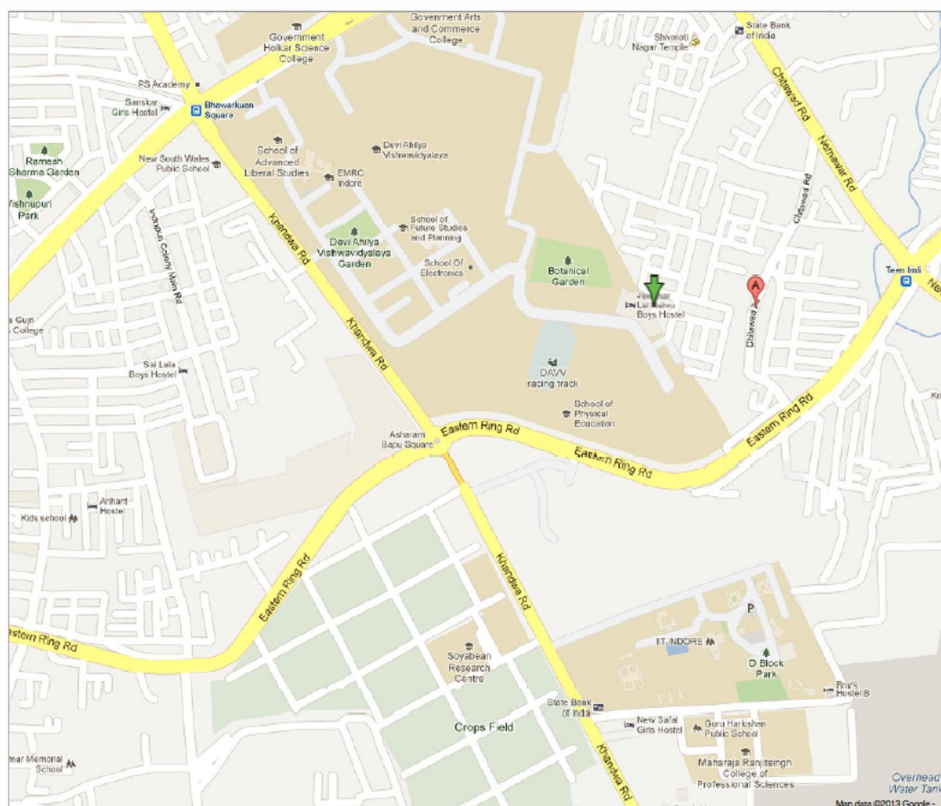
